

1 **IN THE SUPERIOR COURT OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF BUTTE**
2 **GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED**
3 **PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

5 Exercising the authority granted under Governor Newsom’s Executive Order N-38-20, and under
6 Government Code section 68115, and to implement the July 21, 2020 Order of Chief Justice Tani G.
7 Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, this Court does adopt the findings and orders
8 of the Chief Justice and, incorporating the same herein, does HEREBY FIND, DECLARE, and ORDER:

- 9 1. That from July 20, 2020, to August 3, 2020, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of
10 computing time under Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, and 334, if the above-
11 described emergency conditions prevent the Court from conducting proceedings or accepting
12 filings as necessary to satisfy these deadlines on those dates;
- 13 2. That the time periods provided in section 825 of the Penal Code within which a defendant
14 charged with a felony offense must be taken before a magistrate is extended from 48 hours
15 to not more than 7 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise
16 would expire from July 20, 2020, to August 3, 2020, inclusive;
- 17 3. That the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal
18 trial is extended by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the original or
19 previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from July 20, 2020, to August
20 3, 2020, inclusive;
- 21 4. That the time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within
22 which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released from
23 custody is extended to not more than seven days, applicable only to minors for whom the
24 statutory deadline otherwise would expire from July 20, 2020, to August 3, 2020, inclusive;
- 25 5. That the time period provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within
26 which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention
27 hearing is extended to not more than seven days, applicable only to minors for whom the
28 statutory deadline otherwise would expire from July 20, 2020, to August 3, 2020, inclusive;

1 6. That the time period provided in section 334 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within
2 which a hearing on a juvenile dependency petition must be held is extended by not more than
3 15 days, applicable only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire
4 from July 20, 2020, to August 3, 2020, inclusive.
